

PROPOSAL

Kolker & Kolker, Inc. proposes to do the following for the year ending June 30, 2016:

1. Adjust books for the year for preparation of GASB financial statements including ascertaining that all accounts are balanced, recorded and accruals, etc. are made
2. Assist in preparing budget and preparation of estimate of needs
3. Preparation of SA & I report
4. Preparation of Highway Report
5. Assist as necessary in the preparation of the State Library Report
6. Capitalizing assets on depreciation schedules and computing depreciation or assisting City Clerk's office in performing these functions

Drafting the financial statements in accordance with GASB and all required notes and disclosures and assist with management discussion and analysis

Additionally, Kolker & Kolker, Inc. proposes to do the following through June 30, 2017:

1. Attendance at Budget Committee meetings as requested by the Mayor or Committee
2. Present a status report for all funds at Budget Committee meetings as requested
3. Be available to City personnel, Mayor and Council for questions and consultations. This pertains to all department heads, including advisory boards such as golf, recreation center, etc.
4. Attendance at Council Meetings during the year as requested

Our annual fee for these services will be \$23,000, the same as the previous year. Our fee will be billed as follows:

July and August, 2016	\$4,700 per month
September, October, November, 2016 & June, 2017	\$2,200 per month
Remaining 6 months	\$ 800 per month

There are several items that could result in additional fees:

1. If expenditures for governmental grants (including FEMA) exceed \$500,000 a "Single Audit" will have to be performed. This will require obtaining information on all of the grants and additional schedules in the financial statements.
2. Additional work requested on projects requested by the Mayor and/or Council.

I will consult with you before billing for any of these possible additional services.

This agreement is contingent upon approval of the City Council for the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma and is not effective or enforceable until same be so approved.



Re: Motor Vehicle Collision, December 12, 2015; Damage to City of Pryor Property

Dear Mr. Larry Lee:

On December 12, 2015, while you were driving your 2011 Ford vehicle traveling westbound on State Highway 20 (Graham Avenue), you negligently collided with a 2003 Ford F-150 Animal Control vehicle belonging to the City of Pryor. You were issued a citation for following too closely and a citation for failing to carry valid insurance verification. The police report in this matter also indicates that you were at fault and following too closely. I am attaching a copy of the police report and the two citations to this letter.

The collision that you caused resulted in extensive damage to a City animal control vehicle and to City equipment. The following is a list of equipment damaged in the collision and the estimated cost to fix/replace the equipment that was either damaged or destroyed in the collision:

Total: \$3,905.25

You are entirely at fault for this collision and are therefore liable to the City of Pryor for the property damage incurred as a result of the collision. Therefore, consider this a formal demand for immediate payment of **\$3,905.25** to the City of Pryor for property damage that you caused in the December 12, 2015 collision.

You have **seven (7) days** to contact me and arrange to make payment in full to the City of Pryor. Your failure to comply will result in the City filing a lawsuit against you to recover those damages. The City will seek recovery for their attorney fees and costs in pursuing this matter should the City be required to file suit against you.



A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PRYOR CREEK, OKLAHOMA RESOLVING TO SUBMIT TO THE REGISTERED AND QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE SAID CITY, THE PROPOSITION THAT ARTICLE II, SECTION 3 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF PRYOR CREEK, OKLAHOMA SHOULD BE AMENDED PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL THOSE PERONS TO SERVE IN THE OFFICES OF POLICE CHIEF, CITY CLERK AND CITY TREASURER POSSESSED OF QUALIFICATIONS AS ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, the Charter of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma, in Article II Section 3 currently provides for the election of those persons to serve in the offices of Chief of Police, City Clerk and City Treasurer for two (2) year terms, AND

WHEREAS, the only qualifications to serve in an elective office of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma are those as set forth in Article II, Section 5 of the Charter, that a person be at least twenty five years (25) of age, an actual resident of the city, and a qualified voter of the city, AND

WHEREAS, elected officials may only be removed from office by a proceeding by the Attorney General in the Oklahoma Supreme Court or proceedings for ouster or removal in the State District Court of Mayes County based on extreme levels of misbehavior or neglect of office, AND

WHEREAS, The Mayor and City Council deem it advisable and in the best interest of the City and conduct of the City services to its citizens that the offices of Chief of Police, City Clerk, and City Treasurer be appointed positions whereby they may be made subject to such qualifications and terms of employment as set by ordinance of the City in the best interest of its citizens.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:

That the Mayor and City Council of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma propose that the question of amendment of the Charter of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma, Article II, Section 3 be submitted to a vote of the registered and qualified voters of the City amending said provision as follows, to-wit:

ARTICLE II

ELECTIONS

Section 3 Time Of Election -- Officials Elected - Officials Appointed.

An election shall be held on the first Tuesday in March, 2007, and each four (4) years thereafter in which there should be elected for the city at large one mayor. An election shall be held on the first Tuesday in March, 2007, and each two (2) years thereafter in which there should be elected ~~from each ward for the city at large, one chief of police, one city clerk and one city treasurer.~~ There shall also be elected from each ward one councilman one (1) councilman from each ward. If necessary, as provided under the terms of article 2, section 6, a runoff election shall be held on the second Tuesday in May. On the first Tuesday in March 1990 and each two (2) years thereafter, an election shall be held at which time one councilman shall be elected from each ward. If necessary, as provided under the terms of article 2, section 6, a runoff election shall be held on the second Tuesday in May. It is the intention of this charter that each ward be represented on the city council by two (2) councilmen, one councilman to be elected in odd-numbered years and one councilman to be elected in even-numbered years. The terms of the officials elected hereunder shall begin on the first Monday in May following the elections and they shall serve for a period of two (2) years and until their successors are elected and qualified. (Amended Election 11-7-2006, Res. 2006-4, 8-1-2006)

The Mayor shall appoint, subject to confirmation by the City Council, the persons to serve in the positions of Chief of Police, City Clerk, and City Treasurer; which persons so serving shall be possessed of the qualifications to serve in the office of their appointment as prescribed by ordinance of the City.

That for purposes of submission of said Proposition to a vote of the registered and qualified voters of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma the Mayor is hereby directed and authorized by the Council to call the matter to a vote of the people of said City.

ORDINANCE NO. 2016-_____

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PRYOR CREEK, OKLAHOMA PROVIDING THAT TITLE 2, CHAPTER 2 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CITY OF PRYOR CREEK, OKLAHOMA, REGARDING CITY SALES TAX BE AMENED LEVYING AND ASSESSING A .225% EXCISE TAX (SALES TAX) IN ADDITION TO ANY AND ALL OTHER EXCISE TAXES NOW IN FORCE UPON THE GROSS RECEIPTS OR PROCEEDS DERIVED FROM ALL SALES TAXABLE UNDER OKLAHOMA SALES TAX CODE; PROVIDING FOR THE USE OF THE PROCEEDS OF SAID EXCISE TAX; PROVIDING FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE; PROVIDING FOR NO REPEAL OF TAX; PROVIDING FOR SUBSISTING STATE PERMITS; PROVIDING FOR PAYMENT OF TAX; PROVIDING THAT THE TAX IS IN ADDITION TO TAXES CURRENTLY LEVIED; PROVIDING THAT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE ARE CUMULATIVE AND IN ADDITION TO ANY AND ALL TAXING PROVISIONS OF OTHER CITY ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY OF PROVISIONS; AND CONTAINING OTHER PROVISIONS RELATED THERETO.

WHEREAS, on November 7, 1972 Ordinance No. 72-16 of the city of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma was approved by a majority of the registered voters of the City imposing a 1% city sales tax for the purpose of providing revenues for street improvement, drainage improvement, and extension and improvement of public utilities; AND

WHEREAS, in the year 1994, by approval of the voters of Ordinance No. 94-2, the foregoing Ordinance No. 72-16 providing for a 1% city sales tax was amended providing that the 1% tax imposed be re-allocated in its purpose to provide for 0.65% thereof to the Street Department, 0.125% thereof to Capital Outlay, 0.125% thereof to the city's General Fund, and 0.10% thereof to be allocated between the Street Department and the city's General Fund by Council Resolution; AND

WHEREAS, in the year of 1976 Ordinance No. 76-1 of the city of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma was approved by a majority of the registered voters of the City imposing a 1% city sales tax for the purpose of providing revenues for the general support of the functions of the Municipal Government of the city; AND

WHEREAS, in the year of 1986 Ordinance No. 86-18 of the city of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma was approved by a majority of the registered voters of the City imposing a 1% city sales tax for the purpose of providing 0.50% of the revenues for capital improvements of the Municipal Utility Board, and 0.50% of the revenues to the general support of the functions of the Municipal Government of the city; AND

WHEREAS, in the year of 2002 Ordinance No. 2002-1 of the city of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma was approved by a majority of the registered voters of the City imposing a 0.75% city sales tax for the

purpose of providing 0.50% of the revenues for payment of indebtedness to be incurred in the construction and equipping of the Municipal Recreation Center facility, and 0.25% of the revenues to the payment of operation and maintenance expenses on the Municipal Recreation Center facility and/or the payment of debt service or for the acquisition of equipment for the use of the Municipal Recreation Center facility; With the 0.50% portion of the tax to terminate on the earlier of payment of the debt or 15 years; AND

WHEREAS, in the year of 2011 Ordinance No. 2011-1 of the city of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma was approved by a majority of the registered voters of the City imposing a 0.50% city sales tax for the purpose of (1) constructing and improving streets, drainage facilities and utility relocations, (2) constructing, equipping and furnishing a new city hall, and (3) repairing, refurbishing and equipping the existing Municipal Recreation Center and/or the payment of debt service or projects; With the 0.50% tax to terminate on the earlier of payment of the debt or 15 years;

WHEREAS, the combined total effective current city sales tax rate is 3.75%, with 3.25% thereof being of a permanent duration of time and 0.50% being of a temporary and limited duration of time in effectiveness.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PRYOR CREEK, OKLAHOMA: That Pryor Creek City Code Title 2, Chapter 2 is hereby amended by the adoption and addition of the "Sales Tax Ordinance 2016" to read as follows:

Section 1. CITATION AND CODIFICATION:

This ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the Pryor Creek, Oklahoma, "Sales Tax Ordinance 2016", and is hereinafter referred to as "Ordinance".

Section 2. SUBSISTING STATE PERMITS:

All valid and subsisting permits to do business issued by the Oklahoma Tax Commission pursuant to the Oklahoma Sales Tax Code are, for the purpose of this ordinance hereby ratified, confirmed and adopted in lieu of any requirement for an additional permit for the same purpose.

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE:

This ordinance shall become and be effective on and after October 1, 2016, subject to approval of a majority of the registered voters of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma, voting on same as prescribed by law, said election to be held August 23, 2016.

Section 4. PURPOSE OF REVENUES:

It is hereby declared to be the purpose of this Ordinance to provide revenues for the general support of the functions of the Municipal Government of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma, and all lawful expenditures of the city related thereto.

Section 5. TAX IMPOSED:

There is hereby imposed an excise tax (sales tax) of .225% in addition to any and all other excise taxes (sales tax) now in force; said excise tax to be levied upon the gross proceeds or gross receipts derived from all sales taxable under the Oklahoma Sales Tax Code.

Section 6. PAYMENT OF TAX:

The tax herein levied shall be paid to the Tax Collector at the time and in the manner and form prescribed for payment of municipal sales tax under the State Tax Laws of the State of Oklahoma.

Section 7. DEFINITIONS:

The definitions of words, terms, and phrases contained in the "Oklahoma Sales Tax Code" and provisions of state law applicable to Municipal Taxation (OKLA. STAT. Tit. 68 §§ 2701 et. seq.) are hereby adopted by reference and made a part of this Ordinance.

Section 8. AMENDMENTS:

The people of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma, by their approval of this Ordinance at the election herein provided for, hereby authorize the City by Ordinance duly enacted to make such administrative and technical changes or additions in the method and manner of administration and enforcing this Ordinance as may be necessary or proper for efficiency and fairness or in order to make the same consistent with the Oklahoma Sales Tax Code, as amended, except that the rate of the tax herein provided for shall not be changed without approval of the qualified electors of the City as provided by law.

Section 9. PROVISIONS CUMULATIVE:

The provisions hereof shall be cumulative and in addition to any and all other taxing provisions of the Code of Ordinances of the City.

Section 10. INCORPORATION OF ORDINANCES:

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be included and incorporated in the Code of Ordinances of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma, as an addition or amendment thereto, and shall be appropriately renumbered to conform to the uniform numbering system of the City Code of Ordinances.

Section 11. SEVERABILITY:

The provisions of this Ordinance are severable, and if any part or provision hereof shall be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such adjudication shall not affect or impair any of the remaining parts or provisions hereof.

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE MAYES COUNTY ELECTION BOARD TO CONDUCT A NON-PARTISAN SPECIAL ELECTION ON AUGUST 23, 2016, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE REGISTERED, QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE CITY OF PRYOR CREEK, OKLAHOMA THE QUESTION OF WHETHER ORDINANCE NO. 2016-_____ ADOPTED ON THE 7th DAY OF JUNE, 2016, SHALL BE APPROVED WHICH LEVIES AND ASSESSES AN ADDITIONAL MUNICIPAL EXCISE TAX (SALES TAX) OF 0.225% UNDER ORDINANCE NO. 2016-_____ UPON THE GROSS PROCEEDS OR GROSS RECEIPTS DERIVED FROM ALL SALES TO ANY PERSON TAXABLE UNDER THE OKLAHOMA SALES TAX CODE; PROVIDES FOR THE USE OF THE PROCEEDS OF SAID EXCISE TAX; PROVIDES FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE; PROVIDES FOR NO REPEAL OF TAX; PROVIDES FOR SUBSISTING STATE PERMITS; PROVIDES FOR PAYMENT OF TAX; PROVIDES THAT THE TAX IS IN ADDITION TO TAXES CURRENTLY LEVIED; PROVIDES THAT THE PROVISIONS OF THE ORDINANCE ARE CUMULATIVE AND IN ADDITION TO ANY AND ALL TAXING PROVISIONS OF OTHER CITY ORDINANCES; PROVIDES FOR SEVERABILITY OF PROVISIONS; AND NOTIFYING THE MAYES COUNTY ELECTION BOARD OF THE HOLDING OF SUCH ELECTION.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma, as the legislative body of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma, deems it advisable to submit to the qualified voters of the City the question of whether to enact Ordinance No. 2016-_____ levying and assessing an additional City excise tax (sales tax) as set forth in said Ordinance; AND

WHEREAS, OKLA. STAT. Tit. 26 § 13-102, and any and all amendments thereto, require the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma to give sixty (60) days' notice by resolution of a special election to the Mayes County Election Board, stating therein the date of said election, the questions to be voted upon at said election, and other information necessary for conducting the said election; AND

WHEREAS, Section 36 of the Charter of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma requires the Mayor to call all special municipal elections; AND

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma, has adopted Ordinance No. 2016-_____ which levies and assesses an additional municipal excise tax (sales tax) of 0.225% upon the gross proceeds or gross receipts derived from all sales to any person taxable under the Oklahoma Sales Tax Code; Provides for the use of the proceeds of said excise tax; provides for the effective date; provides for no repeal of tax; provides for subsisting state permits; provides for payment of tax; provides that the tax is in addition to taxes currently levied; provides that the provisions of the ordinance are cumulative and in addition to any and all taxing provisions of other city ordinances; provides for severability of provisions; subject to the approval of a majority of the registered and qualified voters of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma, voting on the same in the manner prescribed by OKLA. STAT. Tit. 11 § 16-101 and 16-112 as amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PRYOR CREEK, OKLAHOMA:

Section 1:

That the Mayor of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma, be and is hereby authorized and directed to call a special election to be held in the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma, on the 23rd day of August 2016, for the purpose of submitting the question as to whether Ordinance No. 2016-_____ shall be approved which levies and assesses an additional municipal excise tax (sales tax) of 0.225% upon the gross proceeds or gross receipts derived from all sales to any person taxable under the Oklahoma Sales Tax Code; Provides for the use of the proceeds of said excise tax; provides for the effective date; provides for no repeal of tax; provides for subsisting state permits; provides for payment of tax; provides that the tax is in addition to taxes currently levied; provides that the provisions of the ordinance are cumulative and in addition to any and all taxing provisions of other city ordinances; provides for severability of provisions.

Section 2:

That the ballot setting forth the following proposition shall be submitted to the registered, qualified voters of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma, at said election, to-wit:

PROPOSITION

"Do you approve City of Pryor Creek Ordinance No. 2016-_____ which enacts a permanent sales tax of 0.225% commencing on October 1, 2016 for the purpose of providing revenues for the general support of the functions of the Municipal Government of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma?"

The ballot setting forth the above Proposition shall also contain in connection with such proposition the following words:

FOR ← -----
The Above Proposition

AGAINST ← -----
The Above Proposition

If the voter desires to vote for the above Proposition, the voter shall complete the arrow to the right of the word "FOR".

If the voter desires to vote against the above Proposition, the voter shall complete the arrow to the right of the word "AGAINST".

Section 3:

That only the registered voters of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma, may vote upon the proposition as above set forth; that the said proposition, as set forth above, must be approved by a majority of the said voters voting on the proposition at said election; and that the returns of said election shall be made to and canvassed by the Mayes County Election Board. That the Mayes County Election Board shall be notified of such special election by receipt of a copy of this Resolution.



RE: Analysis of overbuilt metal roofing solutions in lieu of single ply use

Steve,

The following is a summary of construction costs on two buildings from my recent past. The first, Building #1, was a 9 story structure where the original built up roofing was removed, tapered roof insulation was added to the full roof to assist roof drainage and a 60 mil, single ply roofing was installed with new metal parapet flashings.

Metal Re-Roof, over existing B.U. Roofing:

The second, Building #2 was a single story, wood framed, wood truss structure. The existing joist system was loaded with light metal framing base anchors, girts, columns and roof joists to support a metal framed system to support metal roofing panels. This building was configured so that with an access door framed into a gable face that the existing mechanical roof top equipment continued to be used to heat/cool the building. That effort was supported by additional mechanical work to serve those original roof top mechanical units.

When attempting to compare these real life budget costs for our intended projects the following points should be incorporated into your line of thought.

1. Building #1 above was a nine story structure whereas Arts building will be a two story structure which should lower some of our future costs.
2. Building #2 has existing roof top equipment much closer to the perimeter of the existing roof than was the case in these references. How that mechanical equipment is handled for continued use, through "recessed pockets" built into the roof, or mechanical equipment raised onto visually

exposed platforms, or mechanical equipment relocated (if possible) and reconnected to provide heat/air for the existing building could greatly affect the construction costs.

3. While the roof top equipment of a Building #1 solution can be well handled by the Architects, if a Building #2 (Metal Re-Roof) solution is desired, there is a good probability that Architectural fees would be higher in order to accommodate the Mechanical and Structural engineers that would be required for that solution process.
4. With the somewhat smaller buildings in our project when compared to these references, we may incur a higher cost per foot for the re-roof solutions and a somewhat smaller cost for the one-two story nature of any single ply project building solution.
5. A determination of options for handling the fascias and downspout drainage would also affect the total project cost of a re-roof solution most likely adding to the above references.
6. Given that the previously quoted single ply roofing solution for the PYO building was \$80,000 for that 6800 SF building, an \$11.40 per square foot may be closer to a budgetary figure for the single ply roofing solutions.
7. Re-roof solutions for the Police and Library buildings would have a noticeable change in the streetscape appearance of the community. Given the public fondness for the PYO building this thought should probably be included in determining the final roofing solution for all of these buildings, given that the best total construction costs will come from a single methodology for reroofing these buildings.
8. The CPI numbers above are representative of the percentage of change in the Construction Price Index applicable to the time frame between now and the dates that these projects above were bid.

These issues should be added to our line of thought from yesterday's meeting.

Given the above a construction budget for these roofing replacements would be as follows:

Also, because of the many options for setting the exterior elevations and how the roof top units are handled, I have included small design fee to help establish the appropriate exterior elevations for these three buildings in the event that the metal re-roof options is selected for developing the design intent that would be established with the additional fee structure.

The logical fiber route is shown in red below for Aerial. The 19 Access Points which are green will be installed as part of this design. 
